

How to access your ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS REPORT

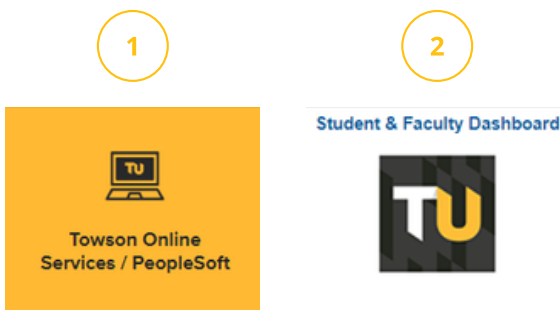
What is an Academic Requirements Report?

Academic Requirements (AR) is an interactive report available via Towson Online Services (PeopleSoft) that assesses student progress toward graduation for the following:

- University undergraduate degree requirements
- Minimum 120 units overall
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative grade point average (CGPA)
- Minimum 32 upper (300-400) level units
- Maximum 13 units graded PS (Pass)
- Core Curriculum Requirements
- Foreign Language requirement (Bachelor of Arts degree students only)
- Honors College Requirements (Honors College students only)
- Major requirements (including concentration or track requirements, if applicable)
- Minor requirements (if applicable)

From MyTU, click on "Towson Online Services / PeopleSoft." Next, click on "Student & Faculty Dashboard."

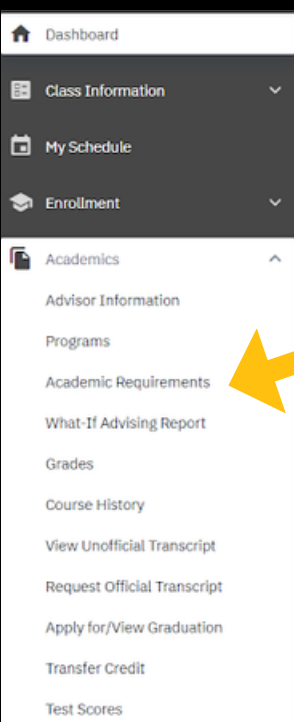

From the Dashboard, click on "Academics."

Note that in this menu, you can find the following information:

- Your assigned advisor
- Your course history
- Your unofficial transcript
- Your transfer credits
- Your test scores

From the Academics menu, click on "Academic Requirements."

This will take you to your Academic Requirements report.



In your Academic Requirements Report, you can find information on your University Undergraduate Degree requirements like your Core classes, as well as your credit count (must reach 120 to graduate).

Click on any of the sections in this report to expand them. If a section is already closed, you have completed the requirement. If a section is open, you have not yet completed the requirement.

Click on the "Psychology Major" Section to view requirements specific to your PSYC major.

In the Psychology Major Section, you can view your course requirements for your PSYC major including:

- Which Statistics & Research option you are choosing
- Which Foundation Courses are required
- How many upper-level and lower-level electives are required
